## SUMMARY HIGHLIGHTS OF SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENTS

- Best ever GCSE results. 70% of students achieved 5 A\* to C grades in summer 2009. 75% of students gained 5 Level 2 qualifications. Level 2 qualifications are the equivalent of GCSE A\* to C
- 95% of students gained 5 A\* to G qualifications. 98% achieved 5 Level 1 qualifications. Level 1 qualifications are the equivalent of GCSE grade A\* to G.
- Best ever A' Level results, with a 99% pass rate and 82% getting the top three grades. 97% of students were accepted into their first or second choice of University place.
- 80% of students gained Level 5 or above in the three core subjects – English, Maths and Science - at the end of Key Stage 3. This is 20% above the Welsh national average.
- After a successful introduction, the Y7 skills-based curriculum is in its second year.
- The Welsh BaccaLaureate has been introduced into Y10.
- Further courses have been added to the curriculum to ensure that all students are able to select areas of study that suit their abilities and interests.
- Following the change in the timings of the school day, a wide range of extra-curricular activities and academies take place after school. Buses, leaving the school at 4.40pm, ensure that all students are able to participate.
- Refurbishment and re-deployment of some accommodation has created a new library with study space available to sixth form students. Sixth form students now have study space and social space available throughout the day. New ICT suites have also been created to support all students.
- The Board of Associates and The Friends Association are working in partnership with the school to support developments, make links and raise funds. The Monmouth Comprehensive Educational Trust (MCET) has achieved charity status.
- The school is involved in the pilot year of a 4-year research project – "Read to Live" - in association with The Reader Organisation and Liverpool University which explores the link between reading and wellbeing. The project will link the school with Monmouthshire Libraries, Primary Schools and community organisations.

The mean percentage of students attaining level 5 and above in the three core subjects (CSI of 80%) continues to be well above the national average (60%). For the first time this year boys and girls have out performed their respective national averages by a similar amount (20%).

The gap between the performance of boys and girls – 11% - has closed considerably this year,

These results place the school in the highest level of achievement bracket – level 1 - for all but two subjects when compared to all schools in Wales and at level 1 for all but three subjects when compared to 'similar' schools.

The stunning improvements in the 5 A\*-C and level 2 threshold achievements (75%) are due, in the main, to consistently high levels of attainment in the core. This is reflected both in the significant improvement in the 5 A\*-C including English and Maths (61%) and the Core Skills Indicator (60%). A large percentage of students are now achieving four, five or even six higher level grades from within the core subjects. This means that, as a school we can truly say we are strong at GCSE across the entire core; the subjects that every student is required to be examined in. The 5 A\*-G and level 1 threshold results (96%) indicate once again that all but two or three students finish the Key Stage with a broad range of qualifications. In a school which is truly comprehensive it could be argued that it is this figure, above all others, which demonstrate inclusion and access.

The diversification of the curriculum in KS4 to include BTEC Level 1 and First (level 2) qualifications, NVQs and components of the DiDA have clearly supported the improvements in the Level 1 and Level 2 threshold achievement. More importantly the availability of this range of qualifications has helped maintain students' engagement in, and positive attitude towards, learning. One hundred and thirty one students achieved Level 2 Communication Key Skill.

It is difficult to provide a 'cast iron' evaluation for such a broad range of improvement indicators, especially in a school such as ours, where a number of strategic improvement strands run hand in hand. As indicated above the diversification of the curriculum has clearly had its part to play; more importantly the learning and teaching on most programmes of study, especially within the core, are now built around ambitious, consistent and constructive learning relationships. The school has been on a learning journey over the last five or so years; these results provide the first substantial indication that continued improvements in learning and attainment should be expected.

Most students are now achieving a minimum of 5 level 1 qualifications after following a full balanced curriculum throughout Key Stage 4. The BTEC Vocational Diploma, which was certificated for the first time this year, provided a small group of students with the opportunity to experience vocational learning at level 1 in a range of settings. Most of these students also achieved a mixture of Entry Level and GCSE qualifications.

Thirteen students achieved NVQ Level 1 qualifications in Construction, Automotive Engineering, Animal Care and Catering. The role of their Vocational Mentor in supporting them through this and many other qualifications cannot be understated. The implementation of whole school mentoring programmes is included in our current School Strategic Plan. One student achieved Key Skill and Entry Level qualifications with the support of the Youth Service.

## **ACHIEVEMENTS FOR 2009 AT KEY STAGE 5**

***Pass Rate 99%                      82% at grade C or above (up 6% on 2008)***

The headline figures speak for themselves. Twenty two students achieved three or more A grades in their A levels; every member of Year 13 achieved certification on their programmes of study. 97% of students (104 out of 107) were accepted onto their first or second choice university course. One of the benefits of the AS/A2 system, with modular exams, is that students can gain externally verified recognition of the progress they are making at interim stages, along with a clear indication of the likely final outcome; they can then take action, and be supported, accordingly. Our performance at A' Level puts us within the top third of schools across the UK.

We continue to evaluate both the appropriateness and diversity of our Key Stage 5 curriculum offer. Along with all other post 16 educational establishments in Wales we are working with our local authority and the Welsh Assembly Government to match the needs of our students to national delivery and funding structures.

### **Level 3: (Equivalent to 3 A levels)**

#### **BTEC National Diploma in Sports and Exercise Science**

All 12 students were successful, 8 with at least 3 Merits, 4 with all 3 awards at Distinction level. As ever, a number have progressed to Higher Education, by following this route, who might not have done so had they been trying to follow an A level programme.

### **Level 2: (Equivalent to 4 GCSEs at Grade C+)**

#### **BTEC First Diploma in Sport**

All 11 students were successful, with 6 achieving Merit and 1 Distinction level. A number of these have stayed on for the two year National Diploma.

## **BTEC First Diploma in Business**

All 12 students were successful, with 6 achieving Merits and 1 a Distinction.

## **BTEC First Diploma in Health and Social Care**

All 4 students were successful with 2 at Distinction, 1 at Merit and 1 at Pass.

Numbers on these courses, and the profiles of the students, vary considerably from year to year. Two out of the three programmes are delivered, for a part of their time, in mixed aged classes alongside Key Stage 4 students. This structure not only promotes course sustainability but also aids peer mentoring and learning.

## 4 Strategic Headlines and the development of School Strategies

The Governing Body has agreed with the school the following areas for further development in the current School Improvement Plan 2008-11:

- 1 **Raising achievement and attainment** – continuing to improve on standards of achievement through accreditation and in all aspects of school life. The School has achieved first class A level results, excellent Key Stage 3 results and exceptional GCSE results this year. The Y7 skills-based curriculum underpins the school's belief that a confident grasp of transferable skills will lead to greater success in students' chosen curricular pathways later on in the school.

Further opportunities for achievement are also available this year through the extensive range of extra-curricular activities available after 3pm, following the changes in the timings of the school day. The current array of activities and academies available are recorded in Appendix 5. Buses serving 5 routes leave the school at 4.40pm on

Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays to ensure that no students are disenfranchised from taking part. This is a pilot being run by and funded by the school from September until December 2009. The school and Governing Body are currently considering how this service can be made sustainable.

- 2 Teaching for Effective Learning** – continuing to focus on developing the skills of teachers and other school staff to support students in their learning. Our excellent support for teachers new to the profession and new to the school as well as continuing professional development for all staff in support of the needs of the school ensures high quality provision.

This year the school has determined that five General Teachers should be employed to teach classes – not just cover them – when the usual teacher cannot be present. The school is confident that this should ensure more effective continuity of learning for students.

- 3 Learner Voice** – ensuring that students are fully engaged with their learning and the school community, that their views are considered and that students know how to make informed choices to improve their achievements.

The most important aspect of Learner Voice is students' involvement in their own learning, reflecting on current achievement and knowing the next step that has to be taken to effect improvement. Students are also active participants in the running of the school community through our active Year and School Councils, the Eco-School Committee, the Joint Schools Council (with Monmouth School for Boys and the Haberdashers Monmouth School for Girls).

Every year senior students are nominated by staff for the prestigious positions of Head Girl and Head Boy. Following letters of application and interviews, students are appointed to fulfil these roles, the Deputy roles and that of prefects. As ambassadors for the school and role models for younger students, the senior student team make a valuable contribution to ensuring that the learners' voice is heard. This year the Head Girl and Head Boy will also liaise with the Governing Body. Prefects and other members of the Sixth Form also take on specific roles in supporting younger students through initiatives such as the Better Reading Partnership, CREW (offering a **Caring Response to Everyday Worries**) and our new project "Read to Live."

- 4 Curriculum development** – continuing to ensure that our curriculum offer meets the needs and aspirations of our students. The School reviews its curriculum every year – in the Autumn term to ensure that all students are well served. This year, the School will consider how to build upon the skills development that has taken place in Y7 and Y8 and towards the broad range of options at 14+ and 16+ offered by the school and the Monmouthshire Network. The Welsh Bacculaureate has been introduced into Y10 this year. Full details of the courses

available are published annually in the KS4 Options booklet (February) and the Sixth Form Prospectus (January).

- 5 **Learning skills** – ensuring that students develop the transferable skills they need for their success in a fast changing world. The publication of the new National Curriculum in Wales has afforded the school the opportunity of reviewing curriculum delivery at Key Stage 3, with the focus on the development of transferable learning skills. A newly formulated curriculum for Y7 was launched in September 2008 and has been closely monitored. The same principles have been extended into Y8: extended learning time with tutors has been retained honing skills developed in Y7, with students also being taught within subject disciplines.
- 6 **Community focus** – broadening and extending the learning experience of all in a spirit of partnership and positive engagement with our communities. The School's Community Focus Strategy has five main objectives:
  - Setting up Community Academies – opportunities for students to be coached after school hours by experts in their field. So far the following academies have been set up: football, boxing, fencing, tae kwondo, street dance, tennis and equestrian studies.
  - Setting up a Personalised Support Centre at the heart of the school to support students wider learning needs through family learning and multi-agency involvement in ensuring success for young people
  - Further developing the Friends of Monmouth Comprehensive School Association and the Board of Associates to support the school in establishing a modern and productive interface with parents and the community, helping to raise funds and secure local business support.
  - Establishing and developing cross-age and lifelong learning opportunities and learning outside normal school hours
  - Identifying, promoting and developing voluntary work so that students can interact with, and support, their local community.

This year the school has embarked on a major new project in association with The Reader Organisation and Liverpool University. This will use The Reader Organisation's "Get into Reading" model to support reading for pleasure both in the school and in the community. The Reader Organisation is a nationally-recognised centre for the promotion of reading. TRO's 'Get into Reading' project (GIR) is a social inclusion programme bringing readers and non-readers together, with health, well-being and educational outcomes.

TRO's intervention is distinguished from other reading therapies in emphasising the importance of serious, 'classic' literature and its role in mediating experience and offering a model of human thinking and feeling. 'Shared reading' means whole books, stories, plays and poems read aloud by a facilitator and/or participants. The model opens up texts which might otherwise be considered inaccessible.

The research project will be asking the following questions:

- Can shared reading aloud for pleasure in our school promote well-being in staff and students with positive educational, professional and social outcomes?
- Can the fostering of a reading for pleasure culture in school have an impact on the well-being and cohesion of the local community?

A number of reading groups have already been set up since September – in Y7, Y8/9, a Great Poets Group, a Staff group and groups in Y7 supported by sixth formers during form periods.

- 7 Support and Guidance / Pathways** – ensuring that students are appropriately supported and guided to make the learning choices appropriate to them and to be successful once those choices are made. Whole school systems for Pathways support have been developed over the last four years.
- 8 Work-related learning and enterprise** – ensuring that students are prepared for, and experience the world of work. Work related learning begins in Year 8 with work experience taking place in the upper school and in the Sixth Form. Enterprise is a new area of focus and will include the development of the Young Enterprise Scheme for Y10 and Y12 students with support from Careers Wales Gwent.
- 9 Sustainable development** – ensuring that our actions and decisions support sustainable development in school, locally and globally. Following the developments reported last year, students and staff are working towards becoming a Green Flag School – the highest award for schools with environmentally responsible policies and practices. The school was nominated for the Sustainable Schools Award as part of the Teaching Awards for 2009.
- 10 The learning environment** – to continue to improve our current school environment while continuing to work towards a new school that is fit for purpose and supports student achievement.

Over the summer, significant refurbishment was completed to further support teaching and learning in the school. This was to:

- create further private study space with computers for the sixth form
- create suites of rooms for some departments that had previously had their classrooms in different areas of the school.
- create further ICT suites for the benefit of all students.

This necessitated moving the library to the other side of the site to the building that used to house the sixth form common room, remodelling the existing library as two classrooms, an office and ICT space for the Welsh

Department and creating 3 new ICT suites. Along with the new laboratory that replaced the old room 48, all the work was completed by the end of August and ready to open for the new academic year.

These alterations have brought considerable benefit to the school this year. As well as the new dedicated study space, sixth form students also have access to the school restaurant and dining facilities from 7am until 6pm daily. The dining hall is set out refectory-style and can be used for socialising and for work that does not require complete silence. The stage area of the hall is also used as a "coffee lounge" for the sixth form.

Monmouthshire County Council's review of secondary provision is now underway. The initial feasibility report has been presented to Cabinet and was widely reported in the local Press in September 2008. The Welsh Assembly Government has also launched its initiative "21<sup>st</sup> Century Schools."
